◇ **Parent Panel**

This group provides the opportunity for parents and carers to have a say about how to develop a better service for children and young people with a disability in Kingston.

Parents and carers meet five times a year in informal and friendly surroundings to talk about how services can be improved. Meetings are held in the evening and childcare can be arranged.
